A staple of Buffalo summers is Bloomsday, an annual celebration of James Joyce. Bloomsday is about to get a whole lot bigger because thanks to New York State funding, the **University at Buffalo Libraries** will be constructing a James Joyce Museum in the area. They received \$10 million for the proposed museum. 
