This is a negative of a photograph that the Buffalo Society of Natural Sciences acquired for educational purposes. They frequently taught visitors about other places and cultures, and often used photographs to do so. The negative shows the glacial valley of Glendalough, located in County Wicklow, Ireland. It is a popular tourist destination not just for the scenic views but also for the fairly intact Early Medieval monastic settlement dating to the 6th century. Visitors can wander the buildings and observe the mysterious round towers that still stand today. Buffalo has a strong Irish-American culture, thanks in part to the many Irish immigrants who built the Erie Canal. In 1866, one of the Fenian Raid attacks on Canada took place from Buffalo due to the city's proximity to Fort Erie. The South Buffalo and Old First Ward neighborhoods still celebrate their Irish-American heritage today. In fact, the City of Buffalo is unique for hosting two St. Patrick's Day Parades, one of which takes place in the Old First Ward. How do you plan to celebrate St Patrick's Day?
